FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER OF REVOCATION

On December 8, 2023, the Arizona Board of Behavioral Health Examiners ("Board") held a formal hearing in the above matter for the purpose of determining whether good cause exists for the Board to discipline Charity E. Northan James, holder of License No. LPC-18935 pursuant to A.R.S. § § 32-3251 *et. seq.* and A.A.C. R4-6-101 et. seq. Assistant Attorney General Mona Baskin appeared on behalf of the State. Assistant Attorney General Roberto Pulver was present to provide independent legal advice to the Board. Respondent was not present.

AAG Baskin introduced 8 exhibits¹ and the testimony of one witness - Tobi Zavala, the Board's Executive Director. After having considered all the testimony and evidence presented, the Board issues the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order for License Revocation.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Charity E. Northan James ("Respondent") is the holder of License No. LPC-18935 for the practice as a licensed professional counselor in the state of Arizona. The Board issued Respondent's License No. LPC-18935 on April 1, 2020 and it remains active until March 31, 2024.
- 2. On or about January 17, 2023, the Board received a complaint against Respondent's License No. LPC-18935.

Respondent, at her email and physical address with the Board, and enclosed a copy of the complaint. The notice of complaint letter advised Respondent that she was required to submit a written response to the complaint within thirty-five (35) days from the date of the letter. The Board advised Respondent that her response must be received by May 3, 2023. The notice of complaint letter advised Respondent of the complaint process and the consequences of her failure to respond. The notice of complaint letter also provided Respondent with the Board staff email address and direct line telephone number should she have any questions. The complaint letter and complaint that were sent by regular mail to Respondent's address of record were not returned to the Board. 4. On or about May 4, 2023, at 2:30 p.m., Board staff emailed Respondent at her email address of record advising her that the response to the complaint as overdue. Board staff requested that Respondent submit a response by May 8, 2023.

3. On or about March 29, 2023, Board staff sent a notice of complaint letter to

- 5. On or about May 4, 2023, at 2:46 p.m., Respondent sent an email to Board staff stating that she had not received the complaint in the mail and asked that the complaint be resent.
- 6. On or about May 5, 2023, at 7:58 a.m., Board staff sent an email response and attached the complaint information and asked Respondent to submit a response as soon as possible. Board staff also asked Respondent to update her physical address with the Board if it is no longer current.
- 7. On or about May 5, 2023, at 11:28 a.m., Respondent sent an email response to the Board that stated, "Received. Thank you."
- 8. On or about May 30, 2023, at 1:56 p.m., Board staff sent an email to Respondent regarding the complaint and her overdue response. Board staff set a June 2, 2023, deadline for Respondent to submit a response. Respondent did not reply to the Board email.

- 9. On or about June 6, 2023, Board staff attempted to call Respondent at 2:20 p.m. and was unsuccessful in contacting Respondent.
- 10. On or about June 9, 2023, Board staff emailed Respondent and copied the Board Executive Director for an explanation regarding why Respondent had not submitted a response. Respondent failed to respond.
- 11. On or about June 11, 2023, the Board's Executive Director emailed Respondent informing her that the complaint response was past due and requested that Respondent call the Board. Respondent failed to respond.
- 12. On or about June 13, 2023, the Board's Executive Director emailed Respondent following up on previous attempts to contact her. Respondent failed to respond.
- 13. On or about June 13, 2023, the Board's Executive Director emailed Respondent through her Psychology Today profile asking her to call the Board as soon as possible. Respondent failed to respond.
- 14. On or about June 21, 2023, the Board's Executive Director emailed Respondent informing her that Board staff will be presenting her case to the Board. Respondent failed to respond.
- 15. On or about July 17, 2023, Board staff sent Respondent an email advising her that her response to the complaint is overdue. Board staff also advised Respondent that her case will be presented at the August 11, 2023 Board meeting.
- 16. On or about July 17, 2023, Board staff emailed and mailed a letter and subpoena for Respondent to appear at the Board meeting pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3282(B)(1). The letter and subpoena were sent to Respondent's two addresses of record by United States Postal Service certified mail.

the Board subpoena. Respondent failed to contact Board staff regarding her non-appearance in violation of the subpoena.

17. Respondent failed to appear at the August 11, 2023, Board meeting in violation of

- 18. On or about August 14, 2023, Board staff sent a Board correspondence to Respondent by email. On or about August 14, 2023, Board staff received verification confirming that Respondent viewed the email containing the Board correspondence at 11:10 p.m. The Board correspondence was also sent by certified mail to Respondent's address of record and according to United States Postal Service records the certified mail was accepted and signed for on August 14, 2023 at 9:53 a.m. Respondent did not contact Board staff after receiving the Board correspondence.
- 19. Board staff verified that Respondent was currently operating an active behavioral health private practice and was not responding to the Board.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The Board has jurisdiction over Respondent pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3251 et seq.
 and the rules promulgated by the Board relating to Respondent's professional practice as a
 licensed behavioral health professional.
- 2. The conduct and circumstances described in the Findings of Fact constitute a violation of A.R.S. § 32-3251(16)(o), failing to furnish information within a specified time to the board or its investigators or representatives if legally requested by the board.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusion of Law, the Board issues the following order:

1. Respondent's license, LPC-18574, is hereby REVOKED, effective immediately.

RIGHT TO PETITION FOR REHEARING OR REVIEW

2	Respondent is hereby notified of the right to petition for a rehearing or review by filing a
3	petition with the Board's Executive Director within thirty (30) days after service of this Order
4	A.R.S. § 41-1092.09. The petition must set forth legally sufficient reasons for granting a
5	rehearing. A.A.C. R4-6-1002. Service of this Order is effective five (5) days after the date of
6	mailing. If a motion for rehearing is not filed, the Board's Order becomes effective thirty-five (35
7	days after it is mailed to Respondent.
